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## Muslim Youth Statistics

- 1 in 10 diagnosed with a Mental Health condition
- 62% Unmarried or Divorced (Aged 22-35)
- 67% Engage in Pre-marital sexual relations
- 91% Female youth unhappy with body image
- 15.5% Prison Population is Muslim (4.8% of UK population)
- 10% Living in the most deprived areas
- 1 in 4 Hold no qualifications (from MCB census report)
- 26% Consume drugs or alcohol regularly
- 78% Teens living a double life
- 89% 'Living the Life' at University
- 10,000 leave Islam as a faith each year
